

The I AM EUROPE project is moving forward: organization of the first awareness workshops with high school students and launch of the website



The I AM EUROPE project (September 2021 – April 2022) aims at raising awareness among the citizens of Alpes Maritimes about the actions of the European Union in France. The project is three-fold, content and target wise:

- The Ulysses component: Raise the awareness of pupils in second year classes in the Alpes-Maritimes about the action of the European Union with a competition game "Imagine your future as a European student". A call for interest has been launched in this sense and several high schools have already come forward. Initially, this action provides for the organization of **Workshops of awareness and reflexion** with the participating high school students, which take place between October 2021 and March 2022. These workshops aim to help high school students better understand the past and present challenges of construction European Union, to initiate a reflection on European values and projects, to make them want to discover other cultures, and to invite them to seize the opportunities offered to them by the EU in terms of education, international mobility or job.
- The workshops took place throughout the month of November (*Or Torah Highschool, Parc Imperial Highschool, Sasserno Highschool*) and they will continue as planned. The awareness and reflexion workshops will be followed by **Workshops for the creation of an artistic project** on the theme of student life in the European university of the future.



The other components, under development, are:

- **Alpes-Maritimes as a field of experimentation:** Raise public awareness of the impacts of R&D projects on the territory and on the daily lives of citizens with a "Did you know that Europe ..." campaign;
- **Innovation component:** Raise awareness among students and the general public of the challenges facing Europe as "innovation society", particularly in the face of the challenge of energy transition in the face of climate change.

LQMS project: Online training for our Russian partners

In the framework of the LQMS project, Université Côte d'Azur organized an online training course on November 9 for 4 Russian partner institutions. The training was provided by three experts from our University: Ms. Lagier, Ms. Saint-Germes and Mr. Leclaire.



This training was dedicated to the creation and renovation of curricula with an emphasis on new conceptions of "training" and "skills". In particular, our experts shared their knowledge and expertise in the following topics such as Tuning project, the skills-based approach, and the development of skills repositories, as well as practical examples of the creation and transformation of curriculum in our university. This work will provide the basis for the creation of a bachelor's and master's degree in health security at Russian partner institutions.

LQMS is a 3-year project (2021-2024) funded by the Erasmus + program, as part of the "Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education" action. It aims to contribute to the development of health safety and quality management of health care in Russia, Kazakhstan and Azerbaijan.

MOVIDIS: Training on the development and evaluation of soft skills for the project partners



On the 25 and 26 of November, the University of Genoa hosted the MOVIDIS project partners for a training session on the development and assessment of soft skills. A "soft skill" is a specific personal competence that must be action-oriented, transferable and developable. The student, therefore, has to play an active role in building this competence.

Laura Strazzelli, an expert consultant in the field of soft skills and open badges, presented the different methods for determining the competences of students to be assessed and the tools and resources needed for this assessment by teachers, tutors and project leaders.

The open badges issued by the MOVIDIS project will be used to recognize and promote the soft skills acquired during the project. All MOVIDIS students will have the opportunity to develop project-specific soft skills and obtain these open badges at the end of their semesters.

OBERRED: Open Badge Ecosystem for the recognition of competences in research data management and sharing

On 15 November 2021 the OBERRED consortium met virtually for its 5th transnational meeting. This meeting was supposed to take place at the University of Warsaw but the health conditions of the country did not allow the participants to attend in person. All partners participated and discussed the progress of IO2 and IO3 and the creation of their own open badges. The upcoming implementation of quality assurance and the next steps were also discussed.



The objective of the OBERRED project is to create a practical guide that will include the specifics and technical issues of OB, the roles and competences related to RDM and the principles of applying OB to RDM. The project also provides for individual training within partner organizations and working groups through online courses. These trainings will focus on the challenges and methodology of Open Badges and an introduction to WDR. A guide to the ecosystem will complement the training.

In a second phase the badges will be built through collaboration between facilitators and stakeholders. Practically two kinds of badges will be made: the badges linked to training / teaching actions and badges linked to RDM processes, in a more exploratory way. Once made, the badges will be implemented on the partners platforms.

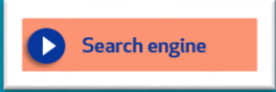
