ANR : Publication of the Action plan and the generic calls for projects 2022



The French Research Agency (ANR) has published the action plan as well as the text of the 2022 generic call for projects. The deadline for submitting pre-proposals is **28 October 2021 (5 p.m.)** for all instruments:

- Collaborative Research Project (PRC)
- Collaborative Enterprise Research Project (PRCE)
- Mono-Team Research Project (PRME)
- Young Researchers (JCJC)
- International Collaborative Research Projects (PRCI)

Note that PRCI project leaders will register their project on the platform. They will not have to submit a pre-proposal in October but will have to submit the full proposal in the second stage at the end of March 2022. The guide specifying the procedures for applying for this call will be published in September 2021 on the ANR website.

REFACE : “European Report on Resilient Regions”

ReFace project (Erasmus+), aims to support key regional players in enhancing their competences and gain up to date knowledge on how to build, further develop and maintain resilient regions and communities. To this aim, project partners conducted a European research about their countries' economic, societal, health, environmental developments and the existing related policies for crisis prevention and management. Questionnaire surveys and semi-structured interviews allowed to identify the training needs of public administration, NGOs and other key stakeholders in the field of regional resilience building.

OBERRED : The MOOC «Being an animator of the ecosystem project» is now available!

This course is oriented towards the acquisition of skills needed by animators of the ecosystem Research Data Management (RDM) / Open Badges (OBs). It assumes that the first two Moocs (Open Badges for Open Science and Basics of managing and sharing research data) have been completed and assimilated. The expected objectives of this course are :



- Define the roles of a facilitator in the ecosystem
- Identify the activities and skills related to Research Data Management (RDM)
- Identify the main arguments for using OBs in an RDM process
- Be familiar with the main steps of project management
- Know the process for creating and issuing an OB

NEMEDUSSA (Erasmus+): first training at Université Côte d'Azur



Université Côte d'Azur has organised a two-week training in the framework of the NEMEDUSSA project dedicated to the taxonomy of nematodes and the molecular tools of nematology in the period July 5-25, 2021.

Despite the difficulties regarding the health crisis, the UCA team in charge of this event, led by Doctor Pierre Abad (INRAe), was able to conduct this training with high quality and in security on the premises of INRAe in Sophia

Antipolis, member of Université Côte d'Azur. Several key topics were covered during this training which combined theoretical knowledge and practical laboratory work in the field of Nematode taxonomy and Molecular Tools in Nematology.

Who benefited from the training: 6 researches and 1 PhD candidate from the partners' universities of Uganda (Makerere University & Muni University) and Ethiopia (Haramaya University & Jimma University). A new session is scheduled for October 2021 to train professors from Benin, South Africa and Nigeria.

NEMEDUSSA is a three-year project of Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education funded by ERASMUS+ programme and coordinated by Ghent University. The goal is to develop research and education in nematology in higher education institutions in Sub-Saharan Africa in order to fight against the food shortage in this area.
